OPEN TO: All Johnston County residents who are 50 years of age or older. A participant's age on **December 31, 2019** will determine the category in which the athlete will compete. Participants will compete against their own gender and age group as follows: 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, etc. A participant must be a resident of Johnston County for three consecutive months.

ENTRY FEE: There is a **\$15** per person entry fee which covers SilverArts and most athletic events. There is an additional fee for golf (\$20), billiards (\$2) and bowling (\$6 per event). Entry fees must accompany the registration form. **FORMS MUST BE POSTMARKED OR SUBMITTED AT YOUR LOCAL RECREATION DEPARTMENT BY March 1, 2019.** Visit www.ncseniorgames.org to register online.

EVENTS: All events are listed on the Registration Form. Athletes may enter as many events as desired.

You must pre-register for any event you plan to enter and picture ID's will be checked at all events 30 minutes prior to event start time.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented to the top three finishers in each event at the SilverArts Showcase/Awards Ceremony on Thursday, April 11, 2019 beginning at 9:30am. Participant ribbons will be given to everyone competing in the "Fun Walk." Local medal winners are eligible to compete at the NC Senior Games in Raleigh in September.

SilverArts - General Information

Heritage, Literary, and Visual Arts entries must be the original work of the artist, must be a work created after the artist turned 50 years old, and must have been completed within two years of the local SilverArts qualifying date of March 1, 2019. Performing Arts entries must be a live performance by the participant. **If you have any questions concerning SilverArts please call Ingrid Wright at 910-200-6602.

CATEGORIES: Participants may enter Visual, Literary, and Heritage crafts; you may enter three pieces per sub-category. You may enter three quilts, three needlework pieces, etc. Please, no more than three pieces per sub-category.

DEADLINE: Please see each Category for specific entry deadlines.

FEE: There is a \$15 entry fee to compete in SilverArts if you are **NOT** already registered for Senior Games.

AWARDS: First, second, and third place winners in each sub-category will receive an award. Each first, second, and third place winner in Heritage and Visual arts will be eligible to show their artwork at the NC Senior Games in October. State Finals will only accept one entry per sub-category, per person. First and second place winners in Literary arts will be eligible for NC Senior Games. Only the first place winner in Performing arts will be eligible for NC Senior Games. Medals for SilverArts & Athletic Events will be awarded at the SilverArts Showcase on Thursday, April 11, 2019 at Smithfield Recreation and Aquatics Center.

ENTRY SPECIFICATIONS: ARTIST'S NAME & TITLE OF ENTRY MUST APPEAR ON OR BE ATTACHED TO ENTRIES.

VISUAL ART

(see entry form for categories)

- All artwork (except sculpture) must be securely wired, individual and ready to be hung (no serrated hooks or string).
- Artwork (except sculpture) can be no larger the 36"x42", including matting and frame.
- Sculptures can be no heavier the 50lbs.
- Sculpture sets may have no more than three pieces per set.
- The art piece must be an original work, not a print.
- Entries must be the original work of the artist, must be work created after the artist is age 50, and must have been **completed within 2 years** of the qualifying date.

LITERARY ART

(see entry form for categories)

- Poems can be no longer than 40 lines and must be typed.
- Short stories (fiction), essays, and life experiences can be no longer then 8 pages, typed and double-spaced.
- All entries must have a title page which includes title of work, sub-category, and name of artist.
- No framed or matted entries will be accepted.
- Johnston County Senior Games will retain all copies.
- Entries must be the original work of the artist, must be work created after the artist is age 50 and must have been **completed within 2 years** of the qualifying date.
- **All Literary Art MUST BE TURNED IN March 1, 2019**

HERITAGE ART

(see entry form for categories)

- Entries must be the work of the individual not a group effort.
- Heritage Arts entries must be an original piece.
- Patterns may be used, no stamped pieces.
- Pottery must be hand-built.
- Latch-hook rugs and pieces from ceramic molds will not be accepted.
- Pieces can be no heavier than 50lbs.
- Sets may have no more than three pieces.
- Entries must be the original work of the artist, must be work created after the artist is age 50, and must have been **completed within 2 years** of the qualifying date.

PERFORMING ARTS

(see entry form for categories)

- Acts are limited to three (3) minutes of "on stage" time.
- Acts may be one of the following: (a) soloists or soloist with accompanists, (b) small group (2-4 performers), or (c) large group (5 or more performers).
- Props are the responsibility of the performer.
- Voice presentations must be a LIVE performance. Background music may be taped. Lip-synch is not permitted.
- Individuals in groups must register separately.
